WHAT DID WE DO?

- The Danish procurement organization Amgros I/S procures 99% of the pharmaceuticals used at public
- environment was an important award criterion along with price.

WHAT DID WE ACHIEVE?

• Amgros received 85 offers from 19 suppliers, of which 76 offers contained the questionnaire about environment.



- Three suppliers won the tender solely due to their environmental capability.

WHY DID WE DO IT?

- To gain knowledge and experience about planning and executing future tenders with environmental criteria.
- To make a mark on the sustainability agenda regarding medicines – both nationally and internationally.
- To increase the amount of sustainable and environmentally friendly medicines.

HOW DID WE DO IT?

The environmental criteria were environmental management, packaging (plastics and paper/cardboard), transportation and social responsibility.

Identifying and qualifying the criteria was a complicated process.


THE PROCES OF IDENTIFYING AND QUALIFYING THE CRITERIA IS DESCRIBED BELOW.

Intense cooperation with the Technical University of Denmark, who made a detailed analysis and report of the possible criteria.

Dialogue meetings with the three pharma industry associations in Denmark representing different interests of the pharmaceutical industry. Written market dialogue with suppliers proposed criteria.





Long process of legal consultation, adjusting the criteria to comply with national procurement legislation.

The tender material was adjusted based on the feedback received. A questionnaire consisting of simple multiple choice questions concerning the environmental criteria became a part of the tender material.

Total offers

- The environmental criteria did not seem to discourage suppliers from bidding; nor did they result in increased price levels for the hormonal therapeutic area.
- The pilot tendering procedure seems to have contributed to a greater awareness among the suppliers about

the importance of the environment and sustainability in the production, distribution, and sales of medicines.

• Now Amgros is in dialogue with pharma industry associations about the green transition of the pharmaceutical industry.

WHAT'S NEXT?

- The experience from this pilot tender will be used in joint Nordic collaboration.
- The experience will be used in future tendering procedures at Amgros.
- The experience will be shared internationally, and it is hoped that the results will encourage other countries to incorporate environmental criteria in future tendering processes for medicines.

Evaluation and identification of winners

6. The bids were evaluated. The price weighted 80%, whereas the environmental criteria weighted 20%.
